Apprenticeships: Investing in Skills for the Future

The Welsh Government is on course to exceed its target of providing 100,000 all-age (from 16+), high quality apprenticeships across Wales.

Since the target was introduced, more than 74,000 individuals have embarked on an apprenticeship allowing them to learn whilst earning a wage and boost their career prospects.

Developing an Existing Workforce

Apprenticeship programmes can be fully funded and used to upskill and develop your existing employees.*

Apprenticeship frameworks offer a structured and supported way to gain a qualification and can be made bespoke to appreciate the differences of each working environment.

Employers of all sizes are reaping the benefits of employee development at all levels, which makes them resilient and dynamic employers of choice.

Employees don't need to be on an Apprenticeship contract or wage and not all programmes include full day release - onsite assessment or workshop options may be available on some programmes.

Apprenticeship Structure

The Apprenticeship Journey

A learner can start at any point on the journey depending on their experience. We will help you and your employee work out whether they should be on a Traineeship, Apprenticeship, Higher Apprenticeship or Degree Apprenticeship. Apprenticeships are available at five different levels: Level 2 (known as a Foundation Apprenticeship in Wales), Level 3 (known as an Advanced Apprenticeship in England), Levels 4 and 5, which are known as Higher Apprenticeships and Level 6, which is a Degree Apprenticeship.

Once they have completed each level, they have the choice to progress to the next level.

Degree Apprenticeship

LEVEL 6

Equivalent to an Honour's Degree.

Progression would be on to post-graduate study.

Higher Apprenticeship

LEVEL 5

Equivalent to a Foundation Degree.

LEVEL 4

Equivalent to a HNC.

Apprenticeship

LEVEL 3

Equivalent to 2 A Levels.

In order to apply for a Level 3 Apprenticeship, you either need to have completed your Level 2 Foundation Apprenticeship or you need to have 5 GCSEs at grade C or above.

Foundation Apprenticeship

LEVEL 2

Equivalent to 5 GCSEs grades A*-C (9 to 4 in the grading system in England).

Skills for Employers and Employees (SEE)



£18.7M Skills for Employers and Employees (SEE) project provides businesses across North Wales with financial support to raise employee skills and knowledge.

The project aims to support employers to build a skilled and adaptable workforce through subsidised training and development and has been extended to 2023.

Vocational training is available in a range of key sectors including: Advanced Manufacturing, Engineering and Construction, Health and Social Care, Land-based, Energy and Professional Services.

Coleg Cambria is the lead provider of a partnership with Grŵp Llandrillo Menai providing training programmes across 6 counties of North Wales: Flintshire. Wrexham. Denbighshire. Conwv. Anglesey, Gwynedd to help improve Skills for Employers & Employees (SEE).

What support will I get?

There's now an even higher level of financial support available through the project in response to the Covid-19 virus situation. Therefore you can reap the rewards of accessing up to 100% subsidised training for your workforce (eligibility criteria applies*) up until the 31st August 2021.

The Employer Engagement and ESF teams will help you carry out an assessment of your staff, and identify the skills gaps and training opportunities within your team. Once a training plan has been agreed, the approved providers will manage the courses on your behalf. All the courses will be specific to the needs of your business and selected to bring the very best out of your team.

*Business must not have exceeded receipt of maximum value 200,000 euros of De Minimis state aid in the last 3 financial years. De Minimis declaration required.

Apprenticeship Levy

As a large apprenticeship provider in the region, we have the experience to ensure we give you the best advice and support through this significant change. We have capability to support clients in both Wales and England with high quality apprenticeship training.

What does the Levy mean for employers?

Levy contributions are collected by HMRC as a percentage of your total payroll bill. The levy only applies to payrolls over £3 million. How you get this back for apprenticeship training is based on where your employees work.

Employers in Wales

For employees working predominantly in Wales you can access funding through the existing provider network funded by Welsh Government. Cambria can access this for you for eligible activity. There is no cap on the amount of apprenticeship funding an employer can access for eligible activity.

Apprentice Incentive Payment

The apprenticeship incentives, which will run from August 2020 to 30 September 2021, will help businesses to recruit apprentices, supporting the development of a workforce that is able to meet changing business needs.

Welsh businesses could receive £4,000 for each new apprentice aged under 25 years they employ for at least 30 hours a week, or £2,000 if employed for under 30 hours a week.

For workers aged 25 and over, businesses can access £2,000 for each new apprentice they hire on a 30 hour or more contract, and a £1,000 incentive for apprentices working less than 30 hours.

There are also incentives for the re-employment of redundant apprentices and the employment of those with disabilities. Payments will be restricted to ten learners per business.

Employers in England

For employees of levy payers based in England, funding is drawn down via a digital voucher scheme for employers to 'spend' on 'apprenticeship' training only (new apprentices and existing staff).

Apprentice eligibility will depend upon where the apprentice spends most of their working time.

If you've been made redundant, or have become unemployed in the last 12 months, you could be entitled to ReAct funding to retrain or update your skills. If you've got a new employer lined up, they too could get funding towards your wages and further training.

Rewrite your career with a **Personal Learning Account (PLA)**

If you live in Wales, are over 19 and earning under £29,534 a year or, you are currently furloughed*, then our range of free and flexible Personal Learning Account courses could be for you.

These courses allow you to gain new skills and qualifications that employers want - helping you to progress in your current career or open up new job opportunities.

You can study these courses around your current job and family commitments with a range of locations and dates available.

*If you're a furloughed worker or at risk of redundancy, you're still eligible to apply for a Personal Learning Account course regardless of your salary level.

ReAct Funded Training Courses

If you've been made redundant, you could be entitled to ReAct funding to retrain or update your skills. If you've got a new employer lined up, they too could get funding towards your wages and further training.

The Redundancy Action Scheme (ReAct) is a programme of funding for training provided by the Welsh Government for people living in Wales who are facing redundancy.

You can receive a training award of up to £1,500 to help you get the skills and qualifications you need to boost your CV and land a job. You can train while you are job hunting or you can go on courses to get the skills you need even if you plan to become self employed eventually.

Criteria for Participation

- ► Must be based in Wales, from the private/third sector and been trading for a minimum of six months.
- ► All jobs created are additional to your existing workforce.
- ► It has to be a quality job opportunity for the young person to gain valuable work experience which will help them gain sustained employment at the end of the six-month period (preferably in your company).
- ► A full job description needs to be created to outline the structure and scope of the role.
- ► The young person has to be gainfully employed for the duration of the programme and be part of your workforce for that period.
- ► You must provide the young person with a contract of employment confirming in writing their terms and conditions of employment.
- ▶ The young person must work a minimum of 16 hours over a 7-day period.
- ▶ The hours worked must be agreed to at the offset and not changed.
- ► The wage must be at or above minimum wage for their age.
- ► The young person must not have been previously employed by yourselves.
- ► The job opportunity is not seasonal, covering sickness, maternity leave, or displacing any existing employees.
- ▶ You are not working with multiple Jobs Growth Wales+ contractors.

All young people must be:

- ► Resident in Wales.
- ▶ Aged 16-18 at point of sign up to programme.
- ▶ Be eligible to live and work in the UK.
- ▶ Be referred either via Working Wales or directly via Coleg Cambria.
- ▶ Be work/apprenticeship ready (have all the minimum qualification requirements in place).

Higher and Degree Apprenticeships

Higher Apprenticeships

Higher Apprenticeships are a great alternative route to achieving higher level qualifications.

They are a nationally accredited work-based programme designed to meet employer needs to build a well qualified workforce. Many Higher Apprenticeships include Degree, HNC and Foundation degree programmes, others include higher level professional courses such as AAT and ILM. They will allow you to learn at degree level with subsidised tuition fees and the opportunity to earn as you learn.

The majority of higher apprentices complete with fantastic job prospects, continuing to work towards promotion or progress to further academic and professional qualifications such as an honours degree or chartered status. You need to be employed in a relevant role to access Higher Apprenticeship funding.

Degree Apprenticeships

Degree Apprenticeships are similar to Higher Apprenticeships, but differ in that they provide an opportunity to gain a full Bachelor's Degree (Level 6).

Our Degree Apprenticeships are developed with employers and Swansea University.

Degree Apprenticeships combine working with studying part-time. Apprentices spend part of their time at Cambria and the rest with their employer.

They can take between three to six years to complete, depending on the course level.

Degree Apprenticeships are still quite new, so there are a limited number of vacancies. It's anticipated that the number of vacancies will grow over the next year or two.
