

College Talk & Tour

1-2 hours Suitable for Years 10 & 11

Choose which site your learners would like to visit and we'll do the rest. During the talk and tour your group will get to have a look around the whole college site including classrooms, workshops, specialist facilities, Student Services, Learning Support, libraries, food outlets and social areas. This will give them a feel for the college with plenty of opportunities to ask questions so they can make a more informed decision about their next steps after school.

Subject Area Talk & Tour

30 mins - 1 hour Suitable for Years 10 & 11 This can be combined with other subject area tours.

Choose which site and subject area your learners would like to visit and we'll do the rest. During the talk and tour your group will get to have a look around the facilities for the selected subject area including any classrooms, workshops and specialist facilities. You will also be able to visit Student Services, Learning Support, libraries, food outlets and social areas at the site. This gives learners a feel for the college with plenty of opportunities to ask questions so they can make a more informed decision about their next steps after school.

Subject Taster

30 mins - 1 hour Suitable for Years 10 & 11

This can be combined with other subject area tours.

Subject tasters give your learners an opportunity to take part in a subject specific session to help them find out if the subject is for them. Tasters may include practical sessions, lectures or hands-on activities depending on the subject chosen.



Wellbeing Workshops and Guided Tour

Half Day (including 45 min Tour) Suitable for Year 11

Choose which site and subject area your learners would like to visit and we'll do the rest. During this half day wellbeing visit you'll have the opportunity to look around your chosen site and facilities in your selected subject area. You will be able to visit our Student Services, Learning Support, Library, food outlets, and social areas at the site. The wellbeing activities will be held in our Wellness Hub which will be your chance to meet key staff, learn wellbeing techniques and your opportunity to ask questions. This is designed to help learners who are struggling with their mental health feel comfortable about starting college in September.






Practical Courses

We offer full time Practical/Vocational courses from Foundation Skills to Level 3 across our sites in Deeside, Yale, Northop, Bersham Road and Llysfasi.

These are mainly two year Vocational qualifications, equivalent to studying three A Levels. These courses blend practical, career focused skills and academic study to prepare you for direct entry into employment, university or apprenticeships. Most of these courses have a work experience element attached to them.

Vocational/Practical courses are typically assessed through coursework and observation of competency in practical skills. Many students taking a two year Level 3 Vocational qualification will study the Advanced Skills Baccalaureate, although staff will clarify whether this applies to you during the application process.

Land-based Courses

We offer a range of full time Practical Land-based courses at our Northop and Llvsfasi sites.

These are mainly two year Vocational qualifications, equivalent to studying three A Levels. These courses blend practical, career focused skills and academic study to prepare vou for direct entry into employment. university or apprenticeships. Most of these courses have a work experience element attached to them.

Vocational/Practical courses are typically assessed through coursework and observation of competency in practical skills. Many students taking a two year Level 3 Vocational qualification will study the Advanced Skills Baccalaureate, although staff will clarify whether this applies to you during the application process.


If you have studied through the medium of Welsh or bilingually at school you can continue to do so at Cambria.
